CLASS FEES: All over fence classes \$17 each, rail classes \$15each.

USEF rules apply (see attached rules). Exceptions for schooling show dress code: Formal attire or informal, your choice.

A Waiver is required for each participant. Youth under the age of 18 must have their waiver signed by a parent or legal guardian. Waivers can be signed with the show secretary upon arrival.

ASTM approved helmets are required for everyone mounted on JUBILEE EQUINE property.



Jubilation Hunter/Jumper Schooling Show Rules

WHIPS: No longer than 30"

EQUIPMENT: Boots, wraps and bandages are prohibited in flat/rail classes. In case of inclement weather competition management may permit the use of bell boots. Protective Boots are allowed in the over fence classes. (see rules <https://www.usef.org> or <https://www.usjha.org>)

GENERAL JUDGING: Circling once upon entering the course and once upon leaving the course is permissible.

FAULTS:

ELIMINATION: 3 refusals, off course, jumping a fence before it is reset, bolting from arena, fall of horse or rider.

PERSONAL APPOINTMENTS: Exhibitors and judges should bear in mind that at all times exhibitors are being judged on ability rather than personal attire.

TACK: Regulation snaffles, pelhams, and fill bridles, all with cavesson nosebands are recommended. A judge can penalize a horse with non-conventional types of bits or nosebands. Boots and bandages are permitted in over fence classes only. Martingales are optional in classes over fences and They are prohibited in flat classes. ABUSE: Cruelty to or the abuse of a horse by any person at a Competition is forbidden, constitutes a violation under Chapter 7 (USAE Rule book), and renders the offender subject to penalty. The show committee must bar violators from further participation for the remainder of the competition. It is the duty of the competition officials and any properly constituted humane organization to report to the Federation any person who indulges in this practice for such further action as may be deemed appropriate. The following acts are included under the words Cruelty and Abuse but are not limited thereto:

| -Excessive use of a whip on any horse in a stall, runway, schooling area, competition ring or elsewhere on the competition grounds, before or during a competition, by any person | -Showing a horse with raw or bleeding sores around the coronets, pasterns, or legs |
| -Hitting the legs of a horse with the butt end of a riding crop or other implement | -Use of any explosive or laser beam devices anywhere on the competition grounds, except in an exhibition or if required in class specifications |
| -Use of any substance to induce temporary heat | -Withholding of feed and water for prolonged periods |
| -Manual poling with any object other than a bamboo pole | -Letting blood from a horse for other than diagnostic purposes |
| -Use of a wire or chain in conjunction with any schooling jump | -Inhumane treatment of a horse in a stall, runway, schooling area, competition ring or elsewhere on the competition grounds, by any person |
| -Use of electrical device in schooling or showing | |
| -Use of shackles, hock hobbles and similar devices | |
